Community & Facilities	Removal of Abandoned Vehicles	Removal of abandoned vehicles and delivery of them to an approved disposal service. Refuse Disposal Amenity Act 1978, Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005	Delegated to Strategic Head of Customer Services (C4.1(a)).
Community & Facilities	Community Safety	Targeting crime and anti social behaviour. Crime and Disorder Act 1998.	Delegated to Strategic Head of Customer Services (C4.1(b)).
Public Spaces	Tree Maintenance	For as along as the Council has trees in its ownership it has a responsibility to maintain its stock to a sufficient and safe standard.	Committee decision to approve current policy.
Public Spaces	Play Area Maintenance	For as long as the council has play equipment in its ownership it has a responsibility to maintain its stock to a sufficient and safe standard.	Committee decision to approve current policy.
Public Spaces	Commons	There is a statutory requirement on the council to take on the maintenance responsibilities for commons if requested by owners.	There is a legal requirement for the council to undertake the maintenance arrangements for commons if requested by the relevant land owners.
Public Spaces	Maintenance of open and closed cemeteries	Maintenance of closed cemeteries once passed to the council by the parochial church council and parish council.	There is a legal requirement for the council to adopt closed churchyards once burials no longer take place and both parochial church council and relevant parish council pass it on.
