Recommendation for Council to vote on	Council resolves that:
	 All Party leaders or their nominees should be included in the decision making process to resolve this issue. Any modifications to the plan should be subject to full public consultation, the results published, described and reflected where appropriate in the plan. A change of fundamental strategy to address identified challenges, including site selection, should be explored with key stakeholders. Resolution to areas of highlighted concern raised by inspectors should be subject to proper independent analysis discrete from site promoter evidence. The 5 year land supply should be updated and made public on a 6 monthly basis in line with current practice. Every effort should be made to work with all partners involved including National Highways and the County Council.

It recognises the potential threat of development beyond the scope of a properly made Local Plan, where control of site selection is limited and delivery of essential infrastructure, including transport and education, is not coordinated.
