<b>Communities and Place</b>	E1: Funding for improvements to town centres and high streets, including better accessibility for disabled people, including capital spend and running costs.
	E3: Creation of and improvements to local green spaces, community gardens, watercourses and embankments, along with incorporating natural features into wider public spaces.
	E7: Support for active travel enhancements in the local area.
	E9: Funding for impactful volunteering and/or social action projects to develop social and human capital in local places.
	E10: Funding for local sports facilities, tournaments, teams and leagues; to bring people together.
	E11: Investment in capacity building and infrastructure support for local civil society and community groups.
	E13: Community measures to reduce the cost of living, including through measures to improve energy efficiency, and combat fuel poverty and climate change.
<b>Supporting Local Businesses</b>	E18: Supporting Made Smarter Adoption: Providing tailored expert advice, matched grants and leadership training to enable manufacturing SMEs to adopt industrial digital technology solutions including artificial intelligence; robotics and autonomous systems; additive manufacturing; industrial internet of things; virtual reality; data analytics. The support is

	<p>E23: Strengthening local entrepreneurial ecosystems, and supporting businesses at all stages of their development to start, sustain, grow and innovate, including through local networks.</p>
	<p>E24: Funding for new and improvements to existing training hubs, business support offers, ‘incubators’ and ‘accelerators’ for local enterprise (including social enterprise) which can support entrepreneurs and start-ups through the early stages of development and growth by offering a combination of services including account management, advice, resources, training, coaching, mentorship and access to workspace.</p>
	<p>E26: Support for growing the local social economy, including community businesses, cooperatives and social enterprises.</p>
	<p>E30: Business support measures to drive employment growth, particularly in areas of higher unemployment.</p>
<p><b>People and Skills</b> *Year 3 only</p>	<p><i>Supporting economically inactive people to overcome barriers to work by providing cohesive, locally tailored support including access to basic skills</i> E33: Employment support for economically inactive people: Intensive and wrap-around one-to-one support to move people closer towards mainstream provision and employment, supplemented by additional and/or specialist life and basic skills (digital, English, maths* and ESOL) support where there are local provision gaps.</p>
	<p><i>Supporting people furthest from the labour market through access to basic skills</i> E34: Courses including basic skills (digital, English, maths (via Multiply) and ESOL), and life skills and career skills** provision for people who are unable to access training through the adult education budget or wrap around support detailed above. Supplemented by financial support for learners to enrol onto courses and complete qualifications.</p>
	<p>E35: Activities such as enrichment and volunteering to improve opportunities and promote wellbeing.</p>
	<p>E36: Intervention to increase levels of digital inclusion, with a focus on essential digital skills, communicating the benefits of getting (safely) online, and in-community support to provide users with the confidence and trust to stay online.</p>
	<p><i>Skills to progress in work and to fund local skills needs</i> E37: Tailored support to help people in employment, who are not supported by mainstream provision to address barriers to accessing education and training courses. This includes supporting the retention of groups who are likely to leave the labour market early.</p>
