## 1. INTRODUCTION / BACKGROUND

- 1.1 In response to the Coronavirus, COVID-19 emergency, the government announced there would be support for small businesses, and businesses in the retail, hospitality and leisure sectors, delivered through the Small Business Grant Fund and the Retail, Leisure and Hospitality Grant Fund.
- 1.2 This additional fund is aimed at small and micro businesses that were not eligible for the Small Business Grant Fund or the Retail, Leisure and Hospitality Fund. As it is a discretionary fund, it is a matter for each Council as to how it distributed. In order to achieve some consistency between Councils in the area the Discretionary Scheme has been developed in partnership with 3 neighbouring authorities in accordance with the government guidance.

## 2. CONSIDERATIONS

- 2.1 Local authorities may disburse grants to the value of £25,000, £10,000 or any amount under £10,000. The value of the payment to be made to a business is at the discretion of the local authority
- 2.2 Grants under the Local Authority Discretionary Grants Fund are capped at £25,000.
- 2.3 The next level payment under the Local Authority Discretionary Grants Fund is £10,000.
- 2.4 Local authorities have discretion to make payments of any amount under £10,000.

- 2.5 These grants are primarily and predominantly aimed at:
  - Small and micro businesses, as defined in Section 33 Part 2 of the Small Business, Enterprise and Employment Act 2015 and the Companies Act 2006.
  - Businesses with relatively high ongoing fixed property-related costs Businesses which can demonstrate that they have suffered a significant fall in income due to the COVID-19 crisis
  - Businesses which occupy property, or part of a property, with a rateable value or annual rent or annual mortgage payments below £51,000.
- 2.6 Government Guidance asks local authorities to prioritise the following types of businesses for grants from within this funding pot: Small businesses in shared offices or other flexible workspaces. Examples could include
  - Units in industrial parks, science parks and incubators which do not have their own business rates assessment;
  - Regular market traders with fixed building costs, such as rent, who do not have their own business rates assessment;
  - Bed & Breakfasts which pay Council Tax instead of business rates; and
  - Charity properties in receipt of charitable business rates relief which would otherwise have been eligible for Small Business Rates Relief or Rural Rate Relief.

### 3. DECISION

3.1 The Discretionary Scheme has been developed in partnership with 3 neighbouring authorities in accordance with the government guidance and a decision has been made at officer level to adopt the scheme for Stroud District Council

#### 4.1 Financial Implications

Fixed minimum allocation of the Local Authority Discretionary Grant Fund is £1,417,000
