Context for the motion (i.e. why is the motion being submitted – what is the proposer aiming to achieve)

Nature is in crisis, nationally and internationally.

The UK is one of the most nature-depleted countries in the world, ranking 228th out of the 240 countries in the Biodiversity Intactness Index. BBC Newsround (2021). For example:

- 41% of our plant and animal species have declined in abundance since 1970, and this decline is accelerating. <u>The</u> State of Nature Partnership (2019)
- The abundance of key pollinator insects has declined 30% since the 1980s. <u>Joint Nature Conservation Committee</u> (2022), <u>DEFRA</u> (2022)
- 1225 ancient woodlands are under threat 981 have been permanently lost or damaged since 2000. Woodland Trust (2021)
- We've lost 90% of our wetland habitats in the last 100 years.
   The Wildlife Trusts (2018-22)
- All English rivers are polluted, only 14% are rated healthy for animals and plants. BBC News (2020)
- Only 38% of protected, biodiversity-rich Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSIs) are in a healthy state and well managed. UK Government (2021)

We do not yet have targets and a delivery plan for the UK Government's commitment in the Environment Act to restore 30% of land for nature by 2030.

In addition, The Government's EU Retained Law Act will scrap 341 environmental protection laws unless new legislation replaces these before the end of this year. EU Laws the government plans to scrap

The Environment Act 2021 introduces new obligations and powers for local authorities in relation to nature. In particular, it is acknowledged that:

- this Council will be a Supporting Authority in the development of the Local Nature Recovery Strategy for Gloucestershire and,
- As Local Planning Authority, this Council will need to assess all planning applications (except for small sites) for the delivery of at least 10% biodiversity net gain from November 2023.

As a council, we can also do our part in championing nature more widely, by ensuring that the protection and restoration of nature is enshrined in everything we do.
